Listening to Birkenshaw - turning our conversations into action

What we did in Birkenshaw

Birstall and Birkenshaw ward councillors supported by Kirklees Council, talked to local people about what life is like in Birkenshaw. We used a tool called the "Place Standard". This is a way of helping to get conversations going about any place (it could be your street, neighbourhood, or town), by using some simple questions. Each of the 1,522 households received an engagement pack including a letter, our 'Listening to Birkenshaw' questionnaire and web links for more information. We have used what we learned to create this action plan, which includes ideas for how to improve the local area.

Who Participated

397 citizens took part, completing 355 Place Standard assessments. Following publication of the results summary, we undertook some further engagement with citizens to check the priorities identified were correct, so we could form the action plan. These events were run during June and July 23.


