'Ask Walpole' – turning our conversations into action

What we did in Walpole

During August and September 2021, local ward councillors, Kirklees Council services and partners encouraged people in Walpole to tell them about what life is like there. 100 people took part, sharing their experiences.

We used a tool called the Place Standard. This is a way of having conversations about any place – it could be your street, neighbourhood, or town – using some simple questions. Ask Walpole was available online with 39 people completing the questionnaire this way. Over all 62 Place Standard assessments were completed.

In July 2024 the Crosland Moor & Netherton ward partnership meeting looked at the priorities in the action plan, which had been identified from the Ask Walpole engagement. A community day was planned to invite people to take part in activities with a view to identifying community champions and help shape the action plan going forwards, with citizens, local ward Councillors, services and partners.

The intention is to create many more opportunities to continue the conversation about how we can make our local places better, ways for people to get involved in the actions and to share ideas and comments.

The aim is to use the information and insights gathered from people, along with what we've learned from other local activities, to develop a focussed plan for investment in Walpole. It will also help to build an evidence base to influence future planning, funding, and work with partners such as West Yorkshire Combined Authority, Police, local community-based organisations, and the local community.
