Your voice in Netherton and South Crosland – turning our conversations into action

What we did in Netherton and South Crosland

In February 2021, volunteers from Netherton and South Crosland Community Group, supported by Kirklees Council, encouraged people across Netherton and South Crosland to tell them about what life is like in the area. 402 people took part, sharing their experiences.

They used a tool called the Place Standard. This is a way of having conversations about any place – it could be your street, neighbourhood, or town – using some simple questions. 'Your voice in Netherton and South Crosland' took place online due to the pandemic lockdown measures. 402 citizens took part, each completing a Place Standard assessment.

In January 2023, 20 people from Netherton and South Crosland Community Group, residents, local ward councillors and council officers took part in the 'Next steps' activities to discuss the results and identify what is important to them. In February 2023, we held a dropin session at Netherton Community Centre to share the results with the wider community and prioritise the themes and actions.

There will be many more opportunities to continue the conversation about how we can make Netherton and South Crosland better, including ways for people to get involved in the actions and to share ideas and comments.

We aim to use the information and insights gathered from local people, along with what we've learned from other local activities, to develop a master plan for investment in Netherton and South Crosland. What we've learned together has also provided evidence that can influence future planning, funding and work with partners such as West Yorkshire Combined Authority, Police, local community organisations and the local community.
